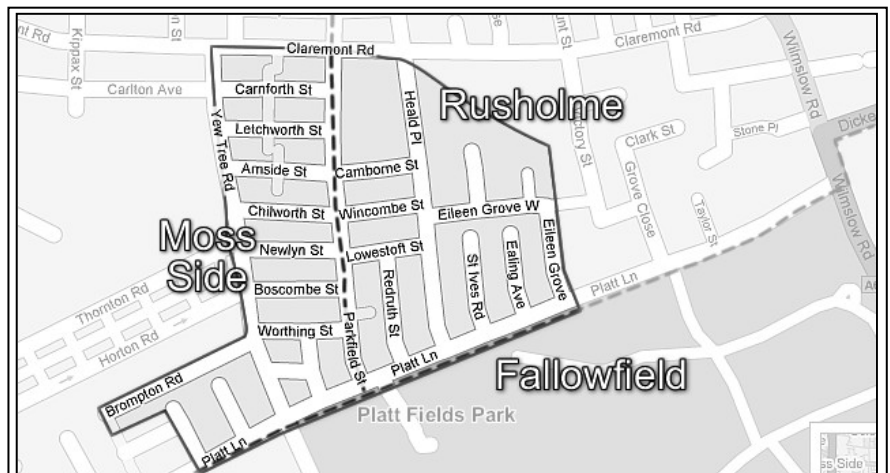


South Rusholme Residents Association

South Rusholme Residents Association has achieved many positive things in the local area, and while we are justifiably proud of the work we have done, following recent discussions regarding attendance at meetings it is clear that we are not attracting enough new active members. In some streets there are long standing members of the community who act as unrecognised street representatives, whilst in other streets some residents may feel they would like to make improvements but do not have the tools or knowledge to achieve this.

Therefore, to try to make our group a more effective and comprehensive voice for the area, we are looking for volunteers as **"Street Representatives"**.

The role will be informal and could involve:-

- 1) Making links with South Rusholme Residents Association which meets monthly. This could be either by receiving information from or giving information to the group.
- 2) Having links with Group members who can offer advice and/or support on a particular project, i.e., tree planting, tidying waste land, links with refuse collection services, crime.
- 3) Participating in discussions with residents of your street on possible improvements.
